Administrator Named President of Statewide City Association

Accordingly, Mequon City Administrator Will Jones, who currently serves as President-Elect, will become WCMA's new President starting July 1. He will succeed current WCMA President and Rib Mountain Village Administrator Gaylene Rhoden, who will assume the role of Past-President. Permission Needed for Removal of Specimen Trees

Because old growth trees provide benefits to all citizens, the City has a Tree Preservation **Ordinance**. The benefits of old growth trees include reducing storm water runoff, preservation of wildlife habitat, enhancement of air quality, and improved aesthetics, among others. Attend Pommerntag This Sunday at Rotary Park


