Recap of July 9 Common Council Meeting


On Tuesday, July 9, the Mequon Common Council held its monthly meeting in the Council Chambers at City Hall. During the Committee of the Whole portion of the meeting, the Council reviewed and discussed proposed updates to the City's Financial Policies. Thereafter, the Common Council held its monthly meeting. During the business portion of

the regular Common Council meeting, the Council acted to:

- 1) Accept the FY2023 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report and Report on Internal Control
- 2) Approve a development agreement for Burr Oak Reserve, a 17-lot subdivision upon the 12.03-acre property located on Donges Bay Road, approximately 700 feet west of Wauwatosa Road
- 3) Approve a development & dedication agreement with Mequon-Thiensville Little League/Mequon Heat for a replacement storage shed at Rotary Park

I-43 North-South Project Progresses; Third Lane Opens



As part of the I-43 North-South project, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is reaching a major milestone and opened the newly constructed third lane on northbound I-43, between Highland Road and WIS 60 (Washington Street), in Ozaukee County today, Friday, July 12. The speed limit on northbound I-43, north of Highland Road, will return to 70 mph. Southbound I-43 is scheduled to remain open to two lanes of traffic through the summer. Also reopening today are Highland Road, between Port Washington Road and Lake Shore Drive, and the I-43 northbound and southbound ramps at Highland Road.

The north-end segment of the project began in early 2022 and spans approximately 5.6 miles from Highland Road to WIS 60 (Washington Street). The entire I-43 North-South project is scheduled for completion in mid-2025. All work is weather dependent and subject to change. Learn more about the project **here**.

2024 Election Updates from the City Clerk's Office



A recent Supreme Court decision allows municipalities to offer drop boxes as a way for voters to return absentee ballots. This modification will take effect with the upcoming November election in municipalities that choose to use drop boxes. Accordingly, any ballots that are delivered in the City of Mequon's drop box for the August election will be returned to the voter.

Voters who would like an absentee ballot mailed to them for the August 13 and/or the November 5 elections can contact the City Clerk's Office. A photo ID must be on file in order to receive a ballot.
