Terms and Conditions of the WI-DNR Nuisance Covote Removal Permit

The WI-DNR has issued a Nuisance Coyote Removal Permit to the City of Mequon which may be temporarily assigned to a resident or contractor who wishes to remove a nuisance coyote.

The use of the WI-DNR Nuisance Coyote Removal Permit allows <u>two additional measures</u> that a hunter/trapper may utilize, including; expanded use of cable restraint style traps and the use of meat product as bait subject to various terms and conditions listed below.

- ➤ Written permission from the property owner must be obtained prior to the WI-DNR Permit being assigned to a resident or contractor.
- Applicant shall meet with a Mequon Police Department representative to discuss/review intended animal removal efforts and location prior to WI-DNR permit being assigned.
- Cable restraint traps, as defined in the Wisconsin Trapping Regulations, may be used under the terms and conditions of the WI-DNR permit.
 - o All regulations except seasonal dates apply to the use of cable restraint style traps.
 - o Traps must be checked daily
 - Any wildlife or domesticated animals captured in a trap used under this permit must be reported to the Mequon Police Department and/or the WI-DNR
 - Coyotes captured under this permit shall be euthanized
- ➤ Up to five (5) pounds of meat bait can be used under the terms and conditions of the WI-DNR permit for shooting coyotes.
 - o Meat bait may NOT be used within 25-feet of a trapping site
 - Meat bait may be placed for a maximum of fourteen (14) days after which all bait must be removed and the site cleaned.
 - o No meat bait site may be re-used during the duration of the Permit
 - Meat Bait may NOT be placed within 100-yards of a current or previous baiting site.
- ➤ Discharge of a firearm or bow and arrow is NOT allowed within 100-yards of a habitable building
- > Failure to follow the terms of the Permit or local/State regulations will result in the revocation of the Permit.

Many other nuisance coyote removal methods are already legal without the need for a WI-DNR Nuisance Removal Permit, including shooting or trapping year-round using scents and/or calls, shooting at night at the point of kill, and using cable restraint style traps from December 1st through February 15th.
